Special Olympics: Lincoln PD was represented at the opening ceremonies for the Special Olympics (Northern California) Summer Games

Auburn Ravine Cleanup: Lincoln PD, Placer County Probation Department, and Placer County Sheriff's Office facilitated a cleanup of illegal campsites in the Auburn Ravine on June 24th using inmate labor. Almost 120 yards of trash was removed.

Officer Tara O'Sullivan: On Sunday, June 25th, a candlelight vigil was held at Sac State for Sacramento Police Officer Tara O'Sullivan, who was killed in the line of duty the previous week. Officer O'Sullivan's parents hoped for a strong showing of female officers and both female Lincoln PD Officers attended. Five Lincoln PD employees attended her memorial service on June 27th.

Lincoln PD Honor Guard: Two Lincoln PD honor guard members presented the flag at the Lincoln Potters superhero game on June 28th. Fire Department personnel attended also.

Coffee with the Mayor: On July 2nd Chief Lee joined Mayor Joiner at his "Coffee with the Mayor" event at the Kilaga Springs Lodge.

4th of July Safety: Lincoln Fire and Police Department have been using social media to push out fireworks safety information.

Public Safety Chief: On June 30 the Fire Department's Shared Services Agreement with the City of Rocklin concluded. Police Chief Doug Lee will now serve as a Public Safety Chief, overseeing both departments. Fire Department Division Chiefs Tolan Dworak and Mike Davis will fill the role of Battalion Chiefs, with the third shift being covered by Captains (acting as Battalion Chiefs).

Two New Engines: The Fire Department's two new engines arrived in Sacramento this past week. Lincoln will receive those following full inspections and training with personnel. They are replacing 18 year old engines at Station 33 and 34 that have over 100,000 miles on them.

Capital Improvement Projects: All Capital Improvement Projects will be updated on the attached CIPTracker Report on at least a monthly basis. Individual Inside Lincoln updates will only be provided for a select group of high profile projects as needed.

K. Hovnanian Homes: The Community Development Department recently issued 19 residential building permits to K. Hovnanian Homes.

TriPointe Homes: The Community Development Department expects to issue an additional eight (8) residential building permits to TriPointe Homes before the end of the week.

New Planning Manager: The Community Development Department welcomes Jim Bermudez as the new Planning Manager. Mr. Bermudez has many years of experience and is excited to return to Lincoln.

City Council Audio Visual Upgrade Project: We successfully broadcasted the last City Council meeting on YouTube, Granicus Live Stream and WAVE. The only issue was the Granicus feed cut off after an hour due to meeting default time of one hour. The Clerks will add this to the checklist to ensure this does not occur in the future. The picture quality is far superior on YouTube and the timing seems to be closer to live than Granicus. As a result, we are going to use YouTube as a primary for streaming on our website. We will still be utilizing Granicus as our archive and will be time stamping the meetings early the following morning.

As stated in our last Inside Lincoln update, there are still issues that need to be resolved. The most critical being the wide angle camera setting for the dais and the lower thirds (this is the title of the agenda item that shows up on the video). We have scheduled AVI-SPL to be onsite on August 2nd to swap-out equipment and adjust the camera locations.
