#### **General Collection Guidelines**



Failure to meet these guidelines may result in your container not being serviced:

- Place containers out by 6:00 a.m.
  - » Green waste cannot be bagged
- Place containers at edge of street (not on sidewalk)
  - » 5 feet apart from one another
  - » 6 feet away from cars and other stationary objects
- Lids must be closed
- Materials must fall freely from the containers when dumped
  - » Containers must not be overfilled
- All trash must be bagged to avoid spills during collection
- Cardboard cannot be left on the ground or against the container
  - » Cardboard recycling bins are placed at Joiner Park and the Twelve Bridges Library.

## Organics Recycling: It's the Law!

- Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) is a State law that was passed in 2016 which set targets to reduce California's organic waste from 2014 levels as follows: a 50% reduction by 2020 and a 75% reduction by 2025.
- Recycled organic waste is processed into compost and mulch after it's collected, which in turn reduces waste going to landfills and turning into greenhouse gas emissions.
- How is the City of Lincoln complying with SB 1383?
  - » One & Done having residents continue to put organic waste into their garbage container that is used for trash, recycling, and food scraps.
  - » Materials in garbage containers are brought to the Materials Recovery Facility and properly sorted using state of the art equipment, machinery, magnet, and humans.

- Organic Waste: solid foods and scraps
- Recyclables: glass, plastic, aluminum, all paper products
- All other trash EXCEPT: batteries, toxic materials, and other hazardous waste.

## **Yard Waste – Green Waste Container**



- Yard waste less than 2 feet long and 2 inches in diameter
- Includes grass clippings, leaves, and pruning

- 96-gallon green waste container: every other week
- Holidays: garbage and green waste are serviced on ALL holidays
