### Looking Back

(These items occurred November 9, 2018 – November 20, 2018)

**In Memory of Laurel Clark:** The Lincoln Police Department placed a bench near their front door in memory of Laurel Clark. Laurel began her career with LPD in 1978, retired in 2012, but continued working as an annuitant. She passed away on November 21, 2017 (just shy of 40 years of service). The bench was built by retired Lincoln Police Lieutenant Paul Shelgren and a small plaque on the bench commemorates her service to our department.

**LPD Recruitment:** Background investigations have been completed on one dispatcher candidate and two police officer candidates. All three are now completing CVSA (truth verification), medical and psychological exams.

**Camp Fire LPD Deployment:** A number of Lincoln Police Officers and Dispatchers have been deployed to the Camp Fire since November 8<sup>th</sup>. All expenses incurred during this mutual aid will be reimbursed through CalOES.

## Victories

**Lincoln Police Department:** At about 2:00 a.m. on November 9<sup>th</sup>, a Lincoln Police Officer checked on a vehicle that was parked in the Lowe's parking lot. The officer saw several items in and around the car that led him to believe it was possibly being used in a crime. While he and other officers checked the surrounding area, the driver returned to the car and started to drive away. The driver, 41-year-old David Reynolds of Rocklin, was arrested for 6 warrants (drugs, theft, false identification, etc.). The officers checking the area found numerous items in the nearby field that appeared to have been recently taken from Lowe's (everything in the field was damp but these items were dry). Lowe's employees responded and determined that the items, valued at over \$2000, had in fact been stolen from them. Evidence at the scene linked Reynolds to the theft of these items. Reynolds was arrested for burglary, possession of burglary tools, possession of methamphetamine, possession of a switchblade knife, providing false identification and prowling. He was booked at the South Placer Jail.

**Adult and Family Literacy Program:** The Adult and Family Literacy program at the library has added an additional three students to its program this month. The grant-supported program pairs English speaking adults who have a limited ability to read and write English with volunteer tutors who help the learners to set and meet meaningful literacy goals in areas such as health, community engagement, and education.

**Lincoln Crossing Village 11:** On October 26th the improvement plans for Lincoln Crossing Village 11 were approved. The private community consists of 166 units and includes a gated entrance onto Groveland Lane, between the future Jimenez Park and Ingram Slough.
