Looking Back

(These items occurred Prior to April 3, 2019)

Auburn Ravine Operation: On April 1st, personnel from the Lincoln Police Department, Placer County Probation Department, Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and The Gathering Inn (homeless shelter) conducted an operation in the Auburn Ravine. The goal was to offer services to those in need, reduce the number of illegal camps, and to arrest those who were found to be committing crimes and/or had warrants. The operation focused on the Auburn Ravine between McBean Park Drive and Joiner Parkway, where Lincoln Police Officers had posted notices on the illegal campsites last week. Staff from HHS and the Gathering Inn offered services to the 30+ homeless individuals that were contacted and three people were arrested for warrants. Following the operation approximately 60 yards of trash was removed from the ravine.

Twelve Bridges Library: As part of the preparations for the opening of the Twelve Bridges High School in 2021, library staff and a representative from the Library Advisory Committee visited Winters Community Library on March 28th. Winters Community Library has been a joint-use library between the Yolo County Library System and Winters High School since 2009, and staff visited to gain a sense of the benefits, challenges, and best practices for providing service to both the public and students.

Condensate Traps – Starting April 1st: It has been suggested that condensate traps be installed on the exhaust systems of all City vehicles. Note that the balanced reaction of internal combustion produces approximately one gallon of H₂O vapor for each gallon of fuel burned. By capturing this vapor from the approximately 140,000 gallons of fuel used by the fleet each year, enough non-potable water could be reclaimed to wash all of the organic waste collection containers weekly. Grant funding of approximately \$2,550,000 would be needed to design the devices, complete the necessary construction and installations and hire two maintenance workers to collect and store the condensate each day. The proposed project is very cost-effective, and staff is already working on the design.

The Spring/Summer 2019 Recreation Guide: The guide is now available online and is expected to be in resident mailboxes by April 12. The Spring/Summer Guide is our largest and most comprehensive publication of the year featuring aquatics, a large variety of summer camps, special events and more.

CPRS (California Parks & Recreation Society) Conference: Recreation staff attended the CPRS (California Parks & Recreation Society) Conference in Sacramento on March 20 – 22. The annual conference offers parks and recreation professionals from across the state an exceptional opportunity to network with peers and to participate in educational sessions and roundtable discussions on a variety of topics related to the field of parks and recreation.

Youth Basketball League: The Lincoln Youth Basketball League concluded on Saturday, March 20. Over 700 boys and girls participated in this year's program.

Youth Flag Football: The Lincoln Youth Flag Football and Lincoln Youth Volleyball Leagues got underway the week of March 11. There are over 200 boys and girls participating in each program.

Adult Softball League: Adult Softball League play (spring) got underway the week of March 11 with 7 Women's teams competing on Monday nights, 9 co-ed teams competing on Tuesday nights, and 19 men's teams competing on Thursday nights.

Wet Season: The tournament season got underway that last weekend in March but mother-nature has not been kind. Of the 7 events scheduled to date, 4 have been canceled due to rain.

Looking Forward

(These items occur after April 3, 2019)

Police Department Retirement: Sergeant Brent Craft is retiring effective April 23rd. An internal recruitment for Police Sergeant was opened and interviews will be conducted April 11th.

City Council Audio Visual Upgrade Project: Project is still on track to begin on April 17, 2019 and should hopefully be wrapped up by April 22nd. However, preliminary cable work may be required which could affect the start date.

Kids Kamp: Lincoln’s Spring Break Kids Kamp will be held April 15 – 19 at Foskett Ranch Elementary.

Lincoln Boulevard Phase 2 & 1A: The contractor continues to work at a slower pace with the continued rain. The traffic signals have been installed on the west side of 3rd Street and work has been proceeding on the east side of 3rd Street. The storm drain system will have a new manhole installed and some new piping as well in front of the Walmart parking lot. The contractor will be taking advantage of UPRR closure at 1st Street on Monday April 8th and begin demolition work on the east side at 1st Street.

Author Claire Booth: On Monday, April 8th, at 6:30 PM, the library will be hosting author Claire Booth. Ms. Booth is a former reporter and an author of both true crime and fictional mystery novels.

El Dia de Los Libros: On Wednesday, April 17th, at 2:30 PM, the library will be hosting its first annual El Día de Los Libros celebration, which emphasizes the joy and value of bilingual children’s literature and the celebrates the Latino/Latina community in Lincoln. The event will consist of crafts and a community resource fair from 2:30-3:30, followed by a bilingual storytime presented in conjunction with Lighthouse Family Resource Center.
