Family Literacy Program: Library staff attended a regional training for the Family Literacy Program, highlighting best practices for providing support to families with caregivers with low literacy. This training will be used to expand and improve the Family Literacy portion of the Adult & Family Literacy programs at the library.

La Quinta Hotel Appeal: On August 30, 2019, the City of Lincoln received an appeal application from the Stop Lincoln Twelve Bridges Hotel (SLTBH). The SLTBH group is requesting the City Council reconsider the Planning Commission's approval of the La Quinta Hotel. Pursuant to the Lincoln's Municipal Code, any person who is not satisfied with an action of the planning commission may appeal to the City Council. As of this

writing, City staff is currently reviewing the submitted materials and has to determine the date of the public hearing. Further information on this project and public hearing date will be distributed in the upcoming days.

Pre-zone and Annexation Application: The City of Lincoln proposes to bring forward a pre-zone and annexation application before the Planning Commission on September 18th and the City Council thereafter. The purpose of the pre-zoning and annexation authorization is to continue processing the Village 5 and Village 7 specific plan areas. The annexation authorization will allow the City to process an application with the County for the annexation of the properties. A notice of the public hearing was posted in the Lincoln News Messenger on September 5th and notices were sent on September 6th. Further information may be obtained by contacting Steve Prosser, Community Development Director.

PCWA Metering Station: Installation of the large diameter pipes and valves in the basement and just outside the building is nearly complete. Several large diameter couplings exhibited signs of distress and were examined by the Construction Manager and manufacturer, and were rejected. New replacement couplings are being installed in 15 locations. Installation of the smaller water, sewer and electrical utilities that will meet-up with the Tank #3 Project is on-going. The CMU masonry block for the project has been produced and is being tested by the special inspector for strength. Masonry walls should be going-up beginning in mid-September.

Capital Improvement Projects: All Capital Improvement Projects will be updated on the attached CIPTracker Report on at least a monthly basis. Individual Inside Lincoln updates will only be provided for a select group of high profile projects as needed.

Homelessness in Lincoln: City Attorney Kristine Mollenkopf and Public Safety Chief Doug Lee met with regional partners to discuss our existing and planned efforts related to homelessness.

Integrated Library System Migration: The RFP for CIP T012, Integrated Library Migration, will be posted Monday, September 9th. Bids will need to be submitted by October 21, 2019.

Planning Commission: On September 18th at 6:00 p.m. on the 3rd floor Council Chambers, the Planning Commission will meet for their monthly scheduled public meeting. The Planning Commission will review and discuss a conditional use permit for a light manufacture business and a pre-zoning application for Village 7 specific plan area. Copies of the submitted applications are available for public review during normal business

hours at the Community Development Department counter. Moreover, a copy of the Planning Commission agenda will be available on the City's website on Friday, September 13, 2019.

5 MG Water Tank at Verdera North: The steel reinforcing for the tank floor has been installed and inspected. The floor is scheduled to be poured on September 5th. A meeting with PG&E was held on-site to coordinate the installation of electric service to the site. Utility work in Bella Circle that extends from the street down to the tank site is scheduled for the next several weeks. Forming of the tank walls will begin after the floor has sufficiently cured.


