Looking Forward

(These items occur after May 29, 2020)

Police Sergeant Position: Following an open recruitment for the position of Police Sergeant, the testing process will take place during June to identify those who will be promoted to fill one current and one expected vacancy.

Building Code Update: The Community Development Department will bring forward a request to City Council to repeal and re-enact Chapter 15.04 and 15.06 of the Municipal Code, regarding Building Regulations.

Urgency Generators Repeal: On May 26th the Community Development Department staff brought forward Ordinance No. 1013B to City Council for their review and consideration. The proposed Ordinance is in response to the multiple enquires and request received from residence last year about installing generators on their properties due to future PG&E power shutoffs anticipated later that year. City Council by a unanimous vote approved Ordinance No. 1013B that set development standards for generators on private properties, with the approval of Council the ordinance will move forward to a second reading scheduled for City Council on June 9th.
