The Community Development Department houses the Planning, Building, and Development Engineering Divisions for the City of Lincoln.

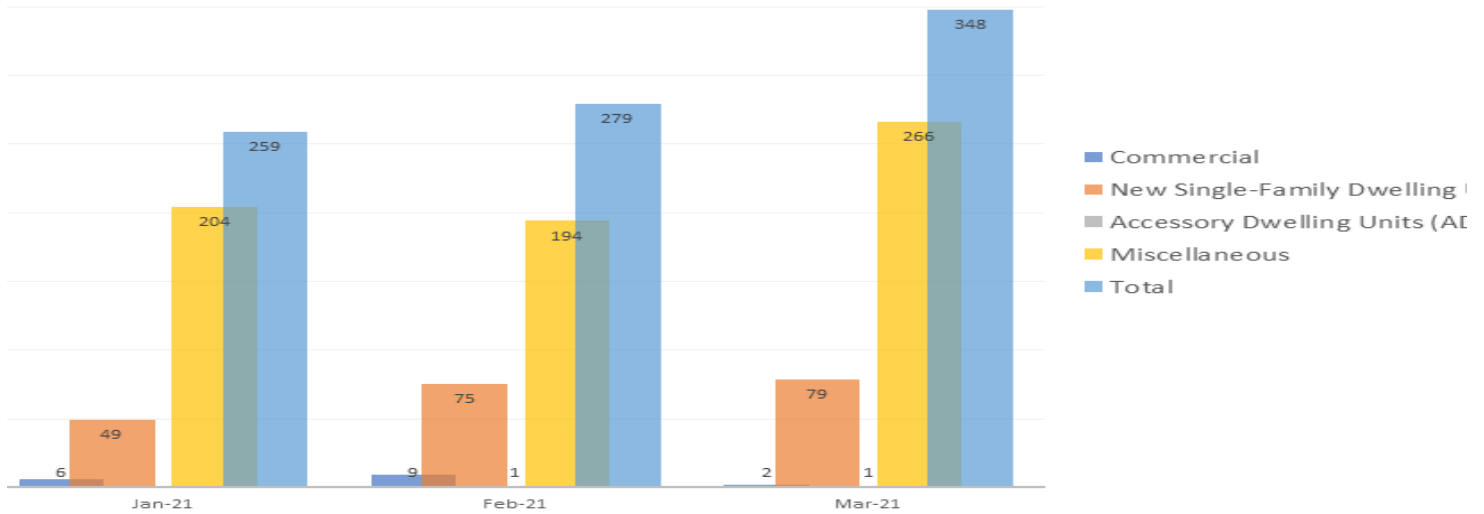

City's Stormwater Outreach Program is Nominated for a 2021 CASQA Award: The City of Lincoln's Stormwater Outreach Program is being nominated for an Award through the California Stormwater Quality Association (CASQA) for the category of Outstanding Stormwater News, Information, Outreach, and Media. The City has made great strides over the past few years in getting an outreach program put together to promote education and awareness of stormwater quality to Lincoln residents and businesses. The Stormwater Program worked closely with the community through several forms of engagement to develop a stormwater brand (logo and slogan). Other notable features added to the stormwater website include eNewsletters, clickable graphics, "Ask the Expert" for pest control advice, on-demand educational videos, and much more. Building Permits Issued: Community Development Department staff processed and issued a total of 348 building permits in the month of March, a significant increase from last month’s issued permits and the highest number this year so far. The Community Development Department will continue to accept, process, issue, and inspect building applications as they are submitted. The counter is open Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Looking Forward

DEA's Rx Take Back: The Lincoln Police Department will again participate in the DEA's Rx Take Back Day. It will take place on Saturday, April 24th from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM in the Police Department front parking lot (770 7th Street).

Advanced Metering Infrastructure Field Survey: Public Works Water Quality group is near completion of Survey 123. Survey 123 is an in-house App developed by the City's IT Team. The App allows our water technician to survey and document details of any water meter location within the City of Lincoln. The purpose of the current survey is to identify all meter locations that may need upgrades for future AMI deployment.

AMI stands for Advanced Metering Infrastructure.

AMI meters, also known as Smart meters are updated versions of the traditional water meter. These new meters not only measure how much water is used, but also at what times during the day.

We fully anticipate completion of the survey consisting of our current "walking routes" by the end April.
