Looking Forward (These items occur after May 28, 2021)

Thank You Chief Lee and Welcome Chief Alves: Chief Lee is retiring, his last day being May 27th. He spent nearly 5 years with the City of Lincoln and his leadership and direction were very much appreciated and will help solidify the future of the Lincoln Police and Fire Departments.

On June 1st, Matt Alves assumed the role of Public Safety Chief.

Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC): The application for IRC is open through June 18, 2021. News articles in English and Spanish have been posted on the City's website, eBulletin and Social Media. Additionally, Staff is working with the Redistricting consultant on a website portal and outreach schedule and will post those as soon as they are available.

Joiner Park Parking Lot: Construction will be starting first week of June for the Joiner Park Parking lot project which will rehabilitate the parking lot and expand the parking lot to accommodate for solid waste recycle bins primarily for cardboard waste. Residents will experience a disruption in service to utilize the solid waste bins during construction. The bins will be relocated to Foskett Regional Park during construction and moved back once the project is complete. The project is expected to take approximately eight to ten weeks to complete and is anticipated to be complete by mid-August

East Joiner Parkway Widening Project: Construction activities will run from late May through December 2021. During construction, access to homes and businesses will always be maintained. However, traffic lanes will be reduced to one lane in each direction during construction. The project limits are from Twelve Bridges Drive at East Joiner south to the city limits with City of Rocklin and includes a portion of Field Stone Drive. East Joiner Parkway will be expanded from two lanes to four, include a new bike lane and sidewalk on the west side, a new traffic signal at Westview Drive and a roundabout at Fieldstone Drive.

Oak Tree Maintenance Project: This project will be implementing various maintenance activities to oak trees that are within the City’s open space areas. The different activities include: raising the canopy to ten feet, removal of broken branches, removal of downed branches under the tree or removal of the tree. Staff has worked with a certified arborist for the proper identification of activities to occur to each tree and will also work with a biologist to complete nesting surveys and ensure the appropriate schedule for construction will be adhered to. Bids are scheduled to be opened June 9th.

Airport Underground Fuel Tanks Removal: The fuel tank removal permit has been submitted to Placer County Environmental Health for their review. Fuel tank decommissioning is anticipated to begin in July.

Fire Breaks: The City is currently cutting fire breaks 30 feet behind homes starting in the Foskett Ranch area and working south towards Rocklin. This is being done by weed eating crew. All homes will be complete by July 1st.
