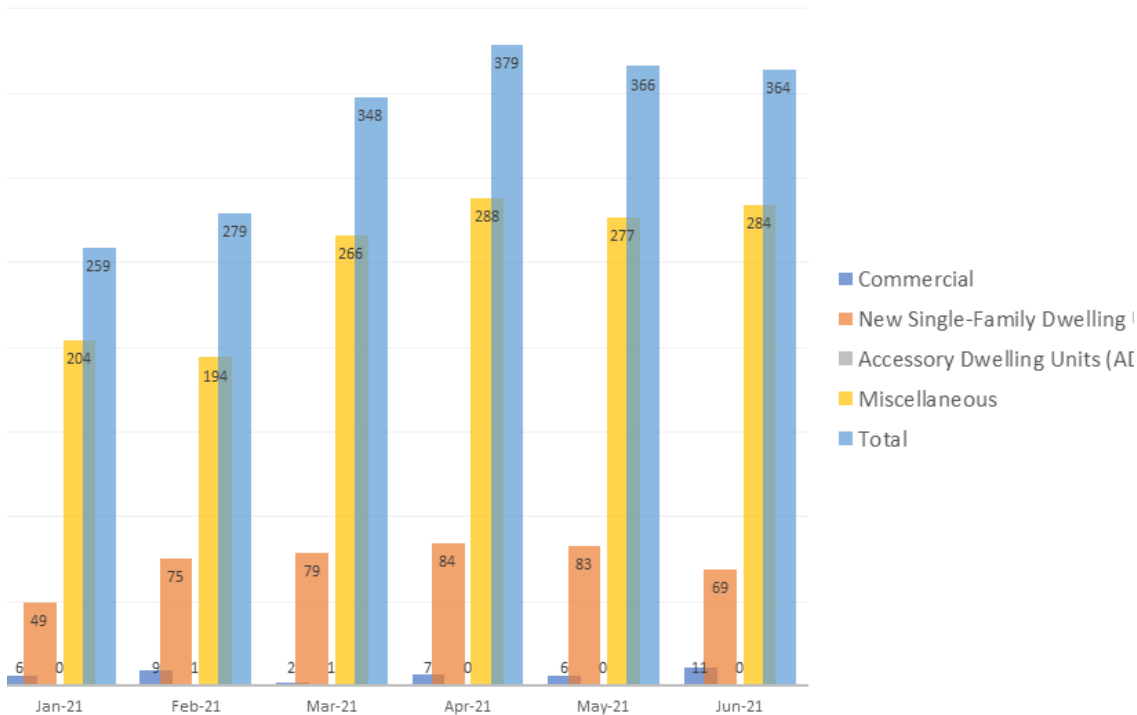
Lincoln Fire Department Calls: 6-29-21 two separate air conditioning unit fires in 12 Bridges Bella Breeze area. One in K Hovnanian and the other KB homes. Both incidents referred to building department.

4th Of July 2055 to 2331 hours the fire department ran 7 overlapping calls- CPR, 3 Fires, a second CPR, 2 additional Medical aids and 1 smoke investigation. CALFIRE was the first arriving unit on 3 of the calls and Rocklin was the first arriving on two calls. 1 engine crew was taken completely out of service or each of the CPR calls to transport with the patient to the hospital.

2020 Northern California MADD Award: Officer Dylan Gorbet was awarded the 2020 Northern California MADD award for our department for his work in combating impaired driving.

Building Permits Issued: The Community Development Department processed and issued a total of 364 building permits in the month of June. The Building department staff will continue to accept, process, issue, and inspect building permits as they are submitted. The counter is open Monday through Friday between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Summer Reading Program: The Library’s Summer Reading Program has almost 600 registered readers, who have completed over 34,000 minutes of reading in the last three weeks.

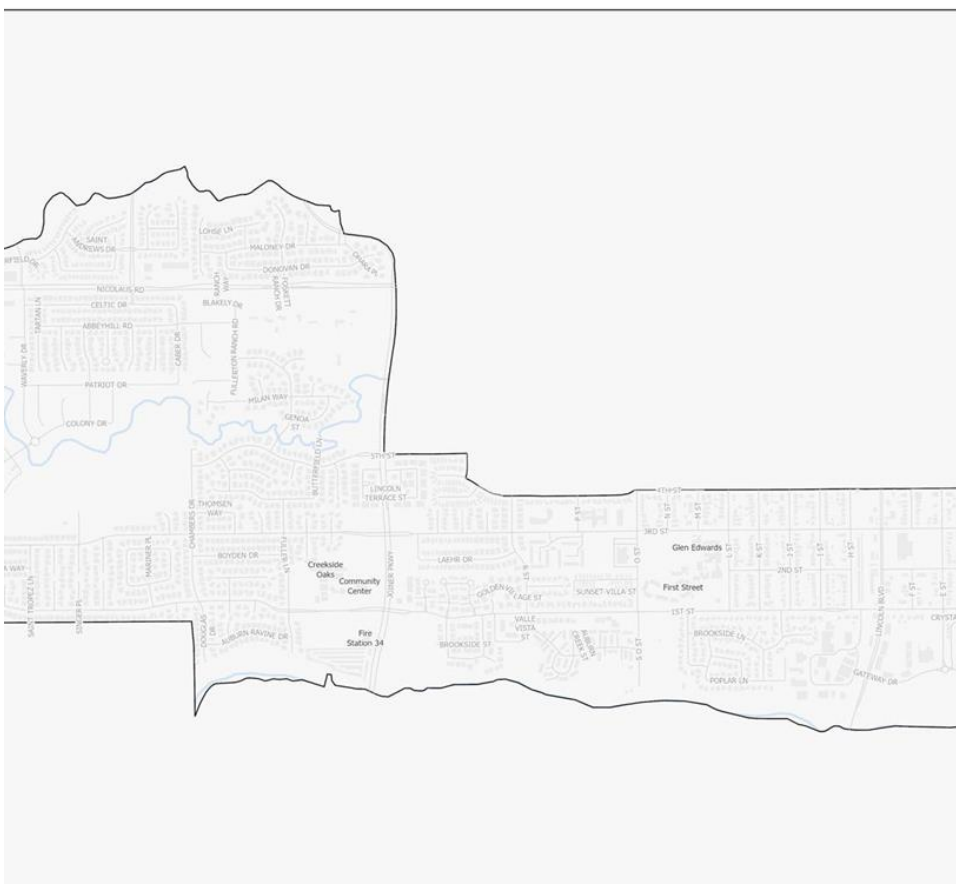
Planning Commission: The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on July 21st at 6:00 p.m., or soon thereafter as possible, at City Hall, Third Floor Community Meeting Room, located at 600 Sixth Street in Lincoln, California, 95648.

City Council Meeting: The City Council of the City of Lincoln will hold a public hearing on July 27th at 6:00 p.m., or soon thereafter as possible, at City Hall, Third Floor Community Meeting Room, located at 600 Sixth Street in Lincoln, California, 95648.

The purpose of this public hearing will be to consider a Tentative Parcel Map to subdivide one parcel into three (3) parcels, and a Small Lot Tentative Subdivision Map to subdivide a portion of Twelve Bridges Village 27 into 184 single-family residential parcels on assessor's parcel number (APN) 329-010-031. The application will be heard pursuant to Title 17 of the Lincoln Municipal Code regarding Tentative Map.

Further information may be obtained by contacting Escarlet Mar, Assistant Planner, in the Development Services Department at 600 Sixth Street, Lincoln, California, or phone (916) 434-2470, during normal business hours. Interested persons are invited to attend the hearing or submit their written comments to the City Council prior to the hearing date.

Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC): The application period for the IRC has been extended to July 16, 2021. We have received 15 applications to date but still need an application from District 2 (see map of District 2 below). Staff has posted the extension in English and Spanish on the City's website, eBulletin and Social Media. Additionally, the website portal (Redistricting.Lincolncal.gov) is now live, click here. We are working on an outreach schedule and will post those as soon as they are available.



Air Pollution Control District: Last month the Placer County Air Pollution Control District inspector approved construction completion for the new wastewater lift station generator at 2873 Delegate Dr. in the Independence development. The operating permit is forthcoming. All eighteen of the other operating permits for the City's stationary generator engines and all twelve permits for portable engines are current, with several due for renewal next month.

Electric Garbage Trucks- The Future: It’s been about four years since the first fully electric garbage trucks were field-tested in California and about two years since the first Mack electric garbage truck went on route. Now that these fully electric prototype trucks have been tested in the field, various manufacturers are gearing up for regular production of similar battery powered trucks. Approximate cost of the one shown below is \$330,000 after the \$120,000 per vehicle basic grant from the California Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project. California is in the forefront of the race to transition to zero emission vehicles. Executive Order N-79-20 stipulates that 100% of medium- and heavy-duty vehicles sales must be zero emission by 2045 where feasible. The City of Lincoln does not currently have electric garbage trucks in its fleet, but will continue to monitor state requirements and budget and plan accordingly.
