**Honoring USMC SGT Gee:** On 8-31-21, Chief Alves attended USMC SGT Gee's vigil in Roseville with Councilmembers Andreatta, Joiner, Lauritsen and Interim City Manager Mark Scott.

**Letters to SGT Gee's Family:** During the week of August 30th, the Lincoln Police Department served as a community drop off location for letters of support to SGT Gee's family. On September 5, hundreds of letters were delivered to the family.

**Local Fire Incidents Summary as of 9/13/21:**

- Dixie Fire (Butte, Lassen, Plumas, Shasta and Tehama Counties) 960,335 acres / 65% contained
- Bridge Fire (Placer Co) - 411 acres/95% contained
- Caldor Fire (El Dorado Co) - 219,267 acres/67% contained

**Fire Department:** On 8/28/21 the Fire Department responded to a pediatric drowning of a 3-year-old in a bathtub, from which the child did not survive. The Fire Department conducted a formal Critical Incident Stress Debriefing for involved staff following the incident.

**Dixie Fire:** Fire Engineer Richard MacCracken was deployed at the Dixie Fire as a Demobilization Unit Leader Trainee - The Demobilization Unit Leader (DMOB) is responsible for preparing the Demobilization Plan and schedule. The Demobilization Unit Leader assists the Command and General Staff in ensuring an orderly, safe, and efficient movement of personnel and equipment from the incident.

**Bridge Fire:** The Fire Department Assisted CalFire after responding to the Bridge Fire (near the Foresthill Bridge) on 09/05/21. Lincoln's Brush #34 was assigned to cover the Bowman CalFire station (and others) until enough resources could be released from the fire on 9/07/21 to resume coverage and release our cover engine.

**Lincoln Senior Apartment Fire:** Fire Department responded to a residential structure fire in the early morning hours of 09/14/21 at the Lincoln Senior Apartments. The building fire sprinkler system suppressed the fire, but the resident sustained significant burns and was transported to the hospital where he did not survive his injuries.

**Resident Structure Fire:** On 09/09/21 the Fire Department received a call for a residential Structure Fire on Butterfield. At the time of call there were no fire units available as they were all assigned to other ongoing incidents. With a slight delay, some were able to break away from the incidents they were on and respond to the fire. Assistance was provided by Placer Co Fire/CalFire, Rocklin and Roseville Fire Departments. The fire originated as a barbecue fire on a covered patio and spread into the home. The fire caused approximately \$255K in damages and the residents are displaced while their home is being repaired.
