

RESOLUTION NO 2015 - 96

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN ADOPTING
REVISED REGULATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON THE
DELIVERY AND CONSUMPTION OF WATER WITHIN THE CITY'S SERVICE AREA

WHEREAS, in 1984 the California Legislature enacted the Urban Water Management Act requiring every urban water supplier providing water for municipal purposes to more than 3,000 connections to update, adopt, and submit an Urban Water Management Plan to the Department of Water Resources every five years, and

WHEREAS, the City's 2010 Urban Water Management Plan was adopted on July 12, 2011 and submitted to the Department of Water Resources, and

WHEREAS, a required component of Urban Water Management Plans is a Water Shortage Contingency Plan, which establishes criteria and guidelines for operations and water conservation during a water shortage condition, and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2014, the Governor issued a proclamation of a state of emergency under the California Emergency Services Act based on current drought conditions, and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted a Water Shortage Emergency Condition Resolution (Resolution No 2014-035) on February 25, 2014, and

WHEREAS, the Water Shortage Emergency Condition Resolution determined that due to drought conditions a water emergency condition prevailed within the City of Lincoln, and

WHEREAS, on April 25, 2014, the Governor issued a proclamation of a continued state of emergency based on continued drought conditions, and

WHEREAS, the State Water Resources Control Board has adopted emergency regulations for Urban Water Conservation at its meeting on July 15, 2014 and again at its meeting on March 17, 2015, and

WHEREAS, these emergency regulations set a requirement for Urban Water Suppliers to implement a stage of their Water Shortage Contingency Plans that have mandatory limits on outdoor irrigation with potable water, and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2015, the Governor of the State of California issued Executive Order B-29-15 finding that California's water supplies continue to be severely depleted and that new expedited actions are needed to reduce the harmful impacts of the drought and requiring additional water use restrictions to achieve a 25% reduction in potable urban water usage through February 28, 2016, and

WHEREAS, in response to the emergency regulations adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board and the Governor's Executive Order B-29-15, the City Council adopted Resolution 2015-51 Declaring a Continued Water Shortage State of Emergency on April 7, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 2015-52 Regulations and Restrictions on the Delivery and Consumption of Water within the City's Service Area on April 7, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted Resolution No 2015-0032 Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation,

WHEREAS, the City's 2010 Urban Water Management Plan does not provide for the necessary regulations and restrictions to comply with the State Water Resources Control Board's Resolution No 2015-0032 Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation,

WHEREAS, Resolution 2015-52 Regulations and Restrictions on the Delivery and Consumption of Water Within the City's Service Area does not provide for adequate regulations and restrictions to allow the City to comply with the State Water Resources Control Board's Resolution No 2015-0032 Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to adopt additional regulations and restrictions on the delivery and consumption of water within the City's service area that are needed to comply with the State Water Resources Control Board's emergency regulations and the Governor's Executive Order, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City Council that these regulations be brought back to the City Council for reconsideration and possible modification or repeal upon repeal or expiration of the State Water Resources Control Board Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Lincoln does hereby adopt the following regulations and restrictions on the delivery and consumption of water within the City's service area


- A Irrigation of outdoor residential ornamental landscaping and ornamental turf with potable water by any person or entity shall be limited to no more than two days per week
Residences with even street addresses shall only irrigate outdoors on Sundays and Wednesdays
Residences with odd street addresses shall only irrigate outdoors on Tuesdays and Saturdays
- B Irrigation of outdoor ornamental landscaping and ornamental turf owned by nonresidential non-publically owned and operated persons or entities with potable water shall be limited to no more than two days per week
Any nonresidential non-publically owned outdoor irrigation may occur only on Monday and/or Thursday of each week
- C Outdoor irrigation of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8 00 AM and 9 00 PM of any day

- D The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature is prohibited unless the water is part of a recirculating system
- E The application of any potable water to outdoor landscaping during and up to 48 hours after measurable rainfall is prohibited
- F Hotel and motel operators shall provide guests with the option of not having towels or linens laundered daily and shall display a notice in each bathroom so notifying the guests of this option
- G Restaurants shall only provide drinking water to guests upon request
- H The application of potable water on driveways, patios, sidewalks, and other surfaces is prohibited unless it is to address an existing health and safety issue
- I The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes substantial runoff onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots or structures is prohibited
- J The application of any potable water to median ornamental turf in any street medians, whether public or private, is prohibited
- K Establishment of new ornamental organic turf is prohibited. All new landscape shall be irrigated with a drip or microspray irrigation system
- L Covers shall be required for all newly constructed pools and spas
- M All leaks shall be repaired within five days or sooner if required by the City
- N Construction water shall only be obtained from a source that has a city-issued meter

The regulations set forth herein shall supersede those regulations set forth in Resolution 2015-52, and Resolution 2015-52 is repealed and replaced by this resolution as of the passage of this resolution. To the extent that these water regulations conflict with any less restrictive requirements identified in the Water Shortage Contingency Plan, these regulations shall prevail.
