**ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN ADOPTING
THE "CITY OF LINCOLN DISTRICT MAP" PURSUANT TO LINCOLN
MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2.05 OF TITLE 2**

THE CITY OF LINCOLN ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Chapter 2.05 of Title 2 of the Lincoln Municipal Code, Section 2.05.020(C), the City Council adopts the City of Lincoln District Map attached hereto, and pursuant to Section 2.05.020(B), directs said map be kept on file in the City Clerk's Office.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be effective at the expiration of thirty (30) days from the date of adoption.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be published in full at least once within fifteen (15) days after it is adopted in a newspaper of general circulation in the City or shall within fifteen (15) days after its adoption cause this ordinance to be posted in full in at least three (3) public places in the City and enter in the Ordinance Book a certificate stating the time and place of said publication by posting.

INTRODUCED at a regular meeting of the City Council held on March 22, 2022.






Polsby-Popper, Reock, Convex Hull, and Length-Width scores fall within the range of 0-1, with 0 being the least compact and 1 being the most compact. In comparison, a Schwartzberg score of 1 is the most compact and higher scores are increasingly less compact.
